DOMESTIC COTTON CROP SCENARIO

Cotton crop has been terminated in Sindh. As per PCGA report Sindh has produced 4.2 million bales and Punjab 6.9 million bales as on 1st January,2018 (155kg). Seed cotton arrivals are in progress in Punjab and it is being expected that arrivals may touch 7 to 7.5 million bales. Better seed cotton and lint prices are prevailing in the market and stake holders are taking better profit. It is expected that cotton crop will gain more area in the next crop season.

Figure -I: SEED COTTON PRICES DURING DECEMBER, 2017



Figure-II: COTTON SEED PRICES DURING DECEMBER, 2017



Figure-III COTTON SEED CAKE PRICES DURING DECEMBER, 2017



The table above shows that the exports of raw cotton witnessed declining tendency but other related produce witnessed mixed trend during the month of November, 2017. The raw cotton exports decreased to 4,648 metric tons valuing Rs.804 million as compared to 7,901 metric tons worth Rs.1,363 million in October, 2017. However, the exports in November, 2016 recorded at 2,635 metric tons amounting to Rs.471 million showing decrease of 41.2% in quantity and 41.0% in value over October,2017.

The table above indicates that the imports of raw cotton during November, 2017 posted gains to 16,099 metric tons amounting to Rs.2,291 million as compared to 10,012 metric tons valuing Rs.1,850 million in October,2017. Whereas the imports in November, 2016 recorded at 10,379 metric tons amounting to Rs. 1,835 million, showing an increase of 60.80 percent in quantity and 23.84 percent in value over October, 2017.

ECONOMICS OF COTTON AND COMPETING CROPS

Cotton a kharif crop, competes with rice, sugarcane and other crops for land, water and other farm resources in the area where the cultivation of all other crops is technically feasible. Mainly cotton faces indirect competition from sugarcane, the annual crop which keeps the land throughout the year. The farmer gives priorities and takes decision on the economics of cotton and competing crops on the basis of inputs-outputs prices paid and received. The estimation of the indicators, like gross cost, gross income, gross margin, net income, input-output ratio, etc may provide the useful sights to the growers at farm level. Details are presented in following table.

REGIONAL COTTON SITUATION



1. CHINA

Cotton area in China is projected to rise by 7% to 3.1 million hectares in 2017-18 as compared to 2.9 million hectares in 2016-17 owing to higher prices during last year. Cotton production in China is also expected to increase by 7.1% to 5.2 million tons in 2017-18 as compared to 4.9 million tons in 2016-17. Whereas mill use is expected to remain stable to 8.1 million tons in 2017-18. Imports by China are remaining steady by 1.3 million tons in 2017-18. China's ending stocks are projected to decline by 16% to 10.6 million tons in 2016-17.

2. INDIA

Cotton area in India is estimated to increase by 9.5% to 11.5 million hectares in 2017-18 as compared to 10.5 million hectares in 2016-17, owing to firm prices in 2016-17. Cotton production in India is expected to grow by 8.7% to 6.2 million tons in 2017-18 as against 5.7 million tons in 2016-17. Mill consumption in India is also likely to grow by 4% to 5.3 million tons in 2017-18. However, exports from India are expected to increase by 8.0% to 1.07 million tons in 2017-18.

INTERNATIONAL COTTON SITUATION 2017-18



The world cotton area in 2017-18 is projected to increase by 11% to 32.5 million hectares as compared to 29.3 million hectares in 2016-17. World cotton production is forecast to grow by 11.7% to 25.7 million tons in 2017-18 as against 23.0 million tons in 2016-17 due to expansion in area. World cotton consumption may recover by 3% to 25.2 million tons in 2017-18 as compared to 24.5 million tons in 2016-17. The world imports and exports are projected to increase by 3.0 percent to 8.3 million tons in 2017-18. The world ending stocks in 2016-17 are expected to decline by 7.4 percent to 18.7 million tons.


